

# Squash veteran looks to juniors

**Eduardo Alvarez may be involved in the competitive squash circuit, but he is also keen on being a part of the junior ranks.**

Alvarez is a squash player who represented Saskatchewan at national competitions as a junior and senior player, and competed at the professional level for many years – he was ranked nationally and on the PSANA tour.

At 33 years, he stills plays competitive singles squash but is leaning towards exploring the booming sport of doubles squash.

He is also looking to help younger players develop through his post as squash director at The Fitness Institute in Willowdale.
